

Dear supporter,

We—your four Massachusetts abortion funds—stand united in our solidarity, blistering fury, and fierce love and protection for our communities. While we have been preparing ourselves for this day, we are no less enraged that our Supreme Court has launched an unconscionable and unprecedented attack on the fundamental right to bodily autonomy, self-determination, and essential health care.

Others in our movement, like the [Center for Reproductive Rights](#), will help us understand what today's ruling will mean for access across the country. In the meantime, it is important that you know this:

Abortion is legal in Massachusetts and the four abortion funds of Massachusetts will continue doing what we do best—fund abortions.

Even with *Roe*, abortion access has been limited and financially inaccessible for far too many—our existence as abortion funds proves this. We all agree that access to abortion shouldn't be determined by your race, your zip code, the size of your bank account, your documentation status, or your gender identity. But today's ruling, along with existing and future abortion bans and restrictions, pushes abortion further out of reach for too many, particularly for Black, Indigenous, and other people of color, people with disabilities, people in rural areas, young people, undocumented people, and those having difficulty making ends meet. The inequities in access to, and politicization of, abortion demonstrate that we cannot rely on the government to make abortion accessible. Rather we must collectively work to ensure that those who need access to care receive it.

We acknowledge and stand in the power of all who came before us and taught us what mutual aid and support look like in action. We stand proud and ready to continue to play a much-needed role in destigmatizing access to abortion. We stand ready to listen to leaders of this national movement who represent the populations and places that are being affected by these hostile bans and legislation, including BIPOC leaders, leaders with disabilities, trans and non-binary leaders, and undocumented leaders.

Abortion funds across the country have been facing increased demand and as the law shifts, this need will only continue to grow. This is where we need you.

You can do two things right now to join us:

- Support abortion funds, practical support organizations, and independent clinics so that we can continue to strengthen and sustain the power we need to navigate the rapidly shrinking landscape of abortion access. These are the groups that will ensure all people, especially those living in states hostile to abortion, can access the care they need. You can give to one of the four Massachusetts funds:
